2) Earth or Heaven

“things above, not on earthly things” (v.3)

3) Put off or Put on

How? seek, pursue (v.1); set, focus (v.2)

- 1) Why would you get up extra early? What would make you want to do so? Why were the women in our story up early?
- 2) What aspect of the resurrection surprises you? Why?
- 3) How might you apply Colossians 3:1-4 to your life?
