



DEAD to Sin

“Shall we go on sinning so that grace may increase?” (v.1)

Timeless principle—“Anyone who has died has been set free from sin.” (v.7)

- Baptism  
means immersion  
“... all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ.” (Galatian 3:27))
- Crucified  
means, the cross  
“I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me.” (Galatians 2:20)
- The Mind  
means consider  
“... count yourselves dead to sin ...” (v.11)

You will not be sinless until heaven, but you may sin less!

- 1) What is the closest you have come to losing your life?
- 2) Why does Paul say more about death than life in this passage? How does knowing you are dead to sin affect your struggle with sin?
- 3) Which point compels you most to sin less—baptism, crucified or how your mind thinks? Why?
