## “logizomai”

References—Romans 8:18, 2:15, 3:28, 4:3-5, 6:11, 8:5

### 1) The Importance of Thinking

“their thoughts sometimes accusing them (or excusing them.)” (2:15)

### 2) The Faith of Thinking

“For we maintain (hold to, conclude, believe) that a person is justified by faith apart from the works of the law.” (3:28)

### 3) The God who Thinks

“Abraham believed God, and it (his faith) was credited (counted) to him as righteousness.” (4:3)

### 4) The Power of Thinking

“In the same way, count yourselves dead to sin but alive to God in Christ Jesus.” (6:11)


## “Count as True”

A look ahead: “Those who live according to the flesh have their minds set on what the flesh desires; but those who live in accordance with the Spirit have their minds set on what the Spirit desires.” (8:5)
