

There is a cultural fascination with heroes. But this is not a new phenomenon. The people addressed in the letter to the Hebrews had a hero also: Moses
Hebrews 3:1-6

We must understand the context. The Jews had a hero because he was
miracle-worker, law-giver, deliverer

The Real Hero . . .

✠ **Heaven**- a holy people headed for eternity
Moses represents earth and the Promised Land
but,
Jesus represents heaven and the Forever Land

✠ **Everything - everyone**
House = people
Moses is a servant; Jesus is the Son

✠ **Reverence- awe**
“The Lord your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among you, from your fellow Israelites. You must listen to him.” (Deuteronomy 18:15)
Fear is awesome or awful

✠ **One & Only**
“Therefore . . . fix/hold firmly” (vv.1 & 6)
Jesus holds the future and he is the only source of lasting hope.

- 2) Why would Moses be so significant to the Jews? How does the author compare Moses & Jesus?
